



Junior High State Alternate Process

ALTERNATES WILL BE CONTACTED BY THE EMAIL ON WRESTLERS ACCOUNT
When there is an opening in a particular weight class the selection process is as follows;

Alternates that are placed up to 72 hours prior to State Weigh-In

- a) Spot goes to the wrestler who finished 7th at the District in which the vacancy occurs. If there is no 7th placer then;
- b) There is a random draw of all other District 7th placers. If the spot remains;
- c) Spot goes to a random draw of all District 8th placers;

Replacements Placed after State Weigh-In must complete Replacement check-in/weigh-in process

- a) Spot goes to a random draw of all District 7th placers; this is repeated till all spots are filled or there are no more District 7th Placers.
- b) Spot goes to a random draw of all remaining District 8th placers. This is repeated till all spots are filled or there are no more District 8th placers.

Bracket Placement of Alternates Prior to the Week of the State Tournament

If an opening occurs because a state qualifier has dropped out of the tournament, all remaining placers that were a lower placement than the wrestler that dropped out, move up a spot to cover the opening and the Alternate is give the spot of the 7th placer.

Bracket Placement of Alternates the Week of the State Tournament and Replacements after State Weigh-In

When an Alternate is placed into the tournament the week of the state event, the rest of the placers do not move. The Alternate is placed directly in the spot of the vacated wrestler.

State Weigh In Directions

If you were originally an alternate and have been notified that you are in the tournament and on the bracket, then you must follow the regular weigh in process

If you are an alternate who has not been notified that you are in the tournament and will be weighing-in in hopes of getting into the tournament, then you must check-in at the alternate check-in table before proceeding to weigh-ins.
